Bhola genuflected before the wise king with a deep sense of gratitude. He followed his advice and lived happily ever after.

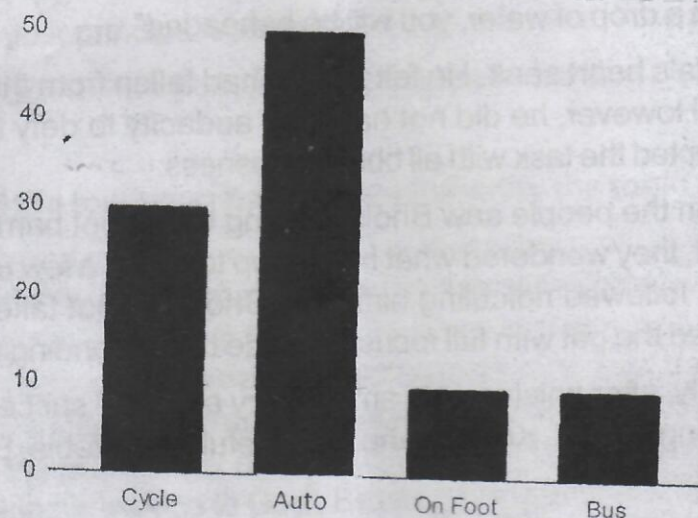
